#### **Purpose:**

To communicate information regarding the Unemployment Insurance (UI) Navigator Program grant.

# Action Required:

Local Workforce Development Boards and their contractors, as well as Employment Security Regional Directors, must distribute this information broadly throughout the system to ensure that WorkSource System staff are familiar with its content.

#### Content:

The <u>UI Navigator program</u> aims to reduce barriers to unemployment benefits by helping unemployed workers learn about, apply for, and, if eligible, receive UI benefits and related services (i.e., navigate the UI program) with an emphasis on workers who are from historically underserved and marginalized communities and adversely affected by persistent poverty and inequality.

Navigators provide outreach, education, and support services to their communities, which may include, but are not limited to, helping individuals understand the claims filing process, educating them on where to locate information, providing general information about claimant responsibilities, directing claimants to online tools and resources, and providing assistance with navigating technology.
