Program Allotments by Workforce Development Area (WDA)

Purpose:

☐Policy-related

To communicate Program Year 2013 and Fiscal Year 2014 Workforce Development Area (WDA) allotments for the WIA Youth, Adult, and Dislocated Worker programs following issuance of state allotments in Training and Employment Guidance Letter (TEGL) 25-12.

Action Required:

Grant packages will be issued within the next week to each WDA. Please complete the packages and return two signed copies to Donna Fussell in the Program Administration Unit for processing.

Content:

Through TEGL 25-12, the U.S. Department of Labor (USDOL) issued the final state allotments for the WIA Youth, Adult, Dislocated Worker programs and the Wagner-Peyser program. The final allotment amounts announced in the TEGL include reductions resulting from sequestration and a 0.2 percent rescission applicable to the "base" funds that States receive on July 1, 2013.

The reductions to WIA and Wagner-Peyser funding in Washington from PY 2012 to PY 2013 are illustrated in the following table:

To avoid rescinding funding already allocated to States and local areas, USDOL elected to fully apply the rescission and sequestration reductions from both the advance and regular appropriations to the July 1, 2013 portion of the PY 2013 allotments. This particularly affects the WIA Adult and Dislocated Worker programs. As a consequence, only 2.68 percent and 9.99 percent of the state's full-year WIA Adult and Dislocated Worker allotments, respectively, will be available in the first quarter.

USDOL plans to release guidance on administrative flexibility that may assist states and local areas in managing the reductions. Upon receipt, WCDD will analyze the information and provide local level guidance through a subsequent WIN.

The attachments show final local WIA program allotments by program year and fiscal year. These tables use updated labor market data within the PY13/FY14 allocation formulae and include hold harmless adjustments (as applicable).
